Supply List

Paints and mediums (one of each)

(I typically buy Golden. Feel free to experiment with other brands, but I've found them to be the best. Liquitex Professional, Amsterdam and Winsor & Newton are OK. Liquitex Basics tends to not have as much pigment. Feel free to bring in colors that aren't on this list.) Please note that supply chain issues have made finding some paints and mediums difficult. Feel free to email me if you need help finding the paint or a replacement for it.

- Ultramarine blue (2 oz tube)
- Phthalo blue (2 oz tube)
- Hansa Yellow (2 oz tube)
- Naphthol Red (2 oz tube)
- Alizarin Crimson Hue (2 oz tube)
- Burnt Umber (2 oz tube)
- Raw Umber (2 oz tube)
- Yellow Ochre (2 oz tube)
- Lemon Yellow (2 oz tube)
- Viridian Green (2 oz tube)
- Sap Green (2 oz tube)
- Chrome Oxide Green (2 oz tube)
- Titanium White (4.65 oz tube)
- Fluid Matte medium (8 oz)
- Optional paints and mediums: Dioxazine Purple, Naples Yellow (2 oz tubes); heavy gel or molding paste for adding texture (2 oz or more)

Brushes & Knifes

(Brushes can be bristle, sable, or nylon. You could try one of each to see what the difference is, if you like. Softer brushes are good for washes without showing the brushmark, firmer brushes are good for loading with paint and painting thickly. You don't need all brushes on the list, but the greater the variety of brushes, the more mark making opportunities you have.)

- #14 or #16 bright or short filbert
- #2 #4 #8 rounds (#6 optional)
- #4 #8 filberts (#6 optional)
- #6 #10 brights (#8 optional)
- Palette knife (for mixing and applying paint to surface)

Painting Surfaces

- 10 canvas boards 16x20" or larger (*Optional*: Use canvases or panels instead of the canvas boards. Sometimes I find good deals at thrift stores, Buy Nothing, or Ross.)
- Canvas pad, canvas paper pad, or mixed media paper pad something for practicing technique.

<u>Acrylic Paint Palette or Disposable Paper Palette</u> (A sealable palette with tear away sheets is recommended like this: https://www.dickblick.com/products/masterson-sta-wet-handy-palette/ Wax paper can also be used on the bottom of the palette for easy clean up.)

Two large jugs for water (I usually save old, plastic juice bottles and cut off the tops.)

Other Recommended Items

- Apron or smock
- soft pencil and eraser
- Rags
- Plant mister/spray bottle to keep paints from drying out as you work
- Optional: Retarder (to slow drying time)
- Optional: fun paints and mediums to play with!
