This class discusses a diverse group of women painters, sculptors, and photographers from the Renaissance to the present, covering various art categories like history, mythology, portraiture, landscape, still life, domestic lives, self-reflection, protest, and abstraction. PAIGE ST-PIERRE

Paige is a Seattle based fiber artist and professionally trained teacher. She creates wearable and visual art pieces from reclaimed papers and textiles. Her process involves altering cloth and paper by dyeing, painting, or printing with botanically derived pigments then creating texture with machine and hand stitches. 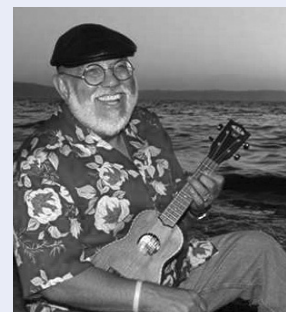

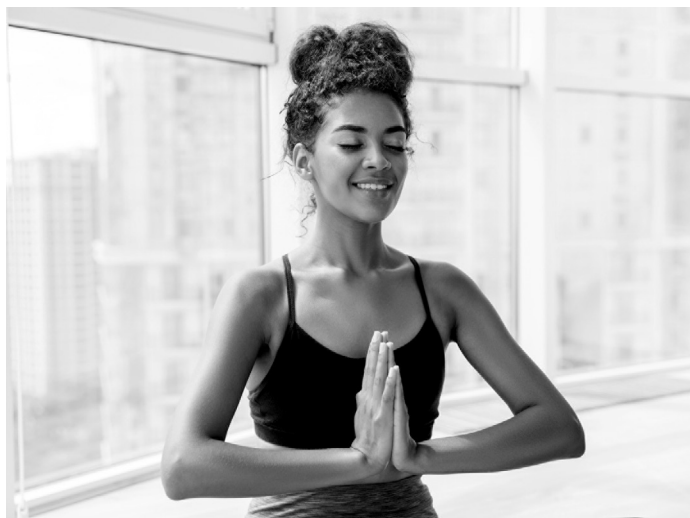

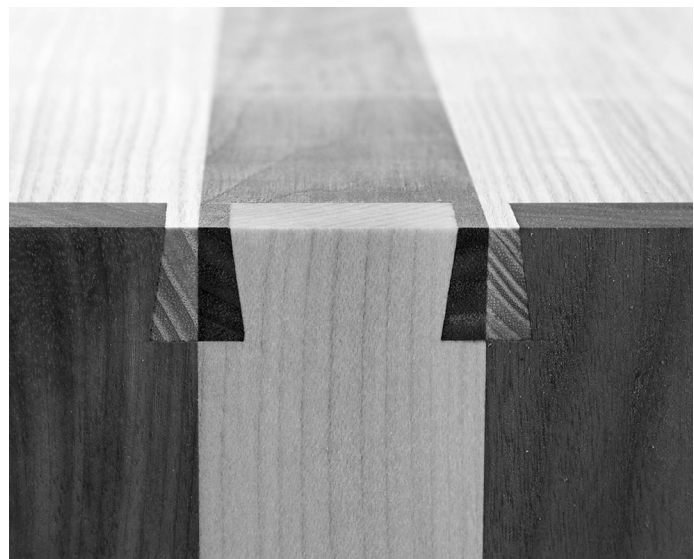
