

Abstract Watercolors

Recommended Supplies:

- Paint
 - Artist/professional paint in tubes like Daniel Smith or Winsor Newton. (Van Gough makes a set of 20 tubes of quality paint at a very affordable price on dickblick.com that will work for beginners.)
- Colors:
 - Ivory or Lamp black, Neutral tint, Quinacridone Magenta, Cadmium red light hue, French Ultramarine blue, Phthalo Turquoise, Lemon or Hansa Yellow, Yellow Ochre, (optional: perylene green, Carbazole or Quinacridone Violet, Quinacridone Burnt Orange, New Gamboge)
- Watercolor Paper: Blick or FLUID BLOCK OF HOT PRESS 12 x 16" 100% RAG/Cotton
- Watercolor Brushes
 - 1.5" or 2" Flat wash with chisel edge (not angle cut)
 - Liner brush (optional)
 - Any other watercolor brushes you may already have
- Catalyst gray silicone "color shaper" #6 –not serrated.
- Large rectangular plastic palette w/ wells and large mixing area –approx. 12x15" (24 wells)
- Large water containers
- Plastic or drop cloth to cover table
- Cotton rags or paper towels
- COLOR wheel: standard 12-color wheel (Itten)
