How the Ninth Street Women Liberated Art History

In her book Ninth Street Women, Mary Gabriel tells their remarkable stories with electrifying truth, candor, and a fresh perspective. Individually and collectively they helped define the Abstract Expressionist movement and challenged societal norms with a new doctrine of liberation. We will examine their art, engage with their stories, and learn how their experiences inspired future generations of women artists. As such, these five women revolutionized the modern art world in postwar America. The legacy of the Ninth Street Women reminds us that art is more than just aesthetics. It is about breaking barriers and creating new paths for others to follow.

Introduction to Drawing

Learn the basic techniques of drawing while working from still life, places in our immediate environment and each other in this introductory drawing class. We will focus on the building blocks of drawing such as composition, measurement, line, shape, value, gesture and mark. You will become familiar with a variety of materials and approaches to drawing by studying

artwork both historical and contemporary. Although instruction will be rooted in drawing from observation, we will explore the potential to abstract from what we see and experiment with working from memory. We will engage in group discussions throughout the course.

Introduction to Drawing 2

Get creative while developing skills learned in an Introduction to Drawing course. We will advance our approaches to creating still lifes, as well as working from the landscape and the figure, both from observation (if possible) and from memory. Students will explore concepts of space, light, and form through previous knowledge of materials such as graphite, charcoal, and ink.

Figure Drawing

Discover the fundamentals of figure drawing in this dynamic class, where we'll explore both observational accuracy and conceptual interpretation of the human form. Rooted in classical drawing techniques, this course will emphasize traditional methods of measuring proportion, constructing the figure with geometric forms, and refining drawings through careful attention to light, shadow, and edge quality. You'll learn to build the body from the inside out—starting with internal structures like the skeleton and layering external forms. We'll also examine different ways to interpret the figure, encouraging you to push beyond naturalism and develop your own visual relationship with the human form. Open to all skill levels! This course involves drawing naked bodies.

Drawing Flowers in Graphite05/20/2026 6:30PM Bundi, Robin

Unleash your creativity and discover the enchanting world of flowers through the magic of graphite drawing. Whether you're a beginner or an intermediate artist, this class is designed to guide you on your journey to mastering realistic flower drawings. We'll build your observational skills, teach you the secrets of value, shading, and form, and help you create a sense of volume and delicate petal textures. You'll learn how to capture accurate proportions using graphite pencils, and you'll work from both photographs and real floral specimens. Throughout the course, you'll practice techniques for line quality, layering tone, and creating depth. By the end of the program, you'll have finished graphite flower drawings that will showcase your talent and skills, and you'll gain valuable insights that can be applied to other drawing and painting media.

Jewelry**Fine Silver Fusing and Loop-in-Loop Chain Workshop**04/11/2026 11:00AM Quarles, M

In this weekend workshop students will learn how to fuse fine silver and how to make various loop-in-loop chain styles. Students will also gain a basic understanding of how to make end caps and different clasps. By the end of the weekend, students will complete either a bracelet or necklace depending on speed.

Introduction to Silver Soldering and Chain Making Workshop04/18/2026 11:00AM Quarles, M

Learn the art of silver soldering in this two-day workshop. You'll start with copper sheet and wire to practice key soldering

techniques, creating chain links and rings. Once you're confident, you can choose to work with sterling silver wire for a more advanced challenge. This class is hands-on and designed for beginners, but anyone looking to sharpen their soldering skills is welcome. You'll leave with a solid foundation in soldering and some beautiful handmade pieces.

Take your jewelry design skills to the next level. Do you have an idea for a complex project you've been wanting to tackle, but not sure where to start, or need to advance your skills to make it happen? Learn multistep soldering, stone setting, forming and finishing techniques that will help make your elaborate jewelry design ideas a reality. The first class is mandatory. If you miss the first class, you will have to be dropped, and you will be issued a full refund.

This course covers the basics of how to design a line of jewelry for production and sale. Students will learn best practices for designing and reproducing a cohesive collection while considering material sourcing, time management, and pricing. This course will also cover business structures, revenue streams, marketing and photography techniques best suited for selling handmade jewelry.

Discover your own creative language and use it to develop your artistic practice. In this class we will use multiple mediums and learn new techniques to push ourselves in exploring self-expression. This class is perfect for someone who has taken abstract art classes before and is wondering "What next?". We will combine mediums: watercolor, acrylic, collage, pencil, oil pastel, and ink. We will explore the use of symbols, written words, texture, drawing and the use of representational images. The goal of this class is to access ourselves as a source for expression; to find an abstract narrative that resonates with you. 2D abstract class experience is helpful.

Abstract Gelli Printing and Collage

Learn the basics of creating monoprints using gelli plates, exploring methods to transfer intricate patterns and textures onto paper. Develop skills in color mixing and layering to produce captivating prints that reflect your individual style. Landscapes in Acrylic Paint

Students will learn to paint beautiful landscapes in this beginner to intermediate acrylic class. The class will cover acrylic techniques, atmospheric perspective (how to create depth in landscape), foliage, plus some fun, alternative ways to approach landscape that may surprise you.

Acrylic Painting for Beginners04/10/2026 10:00AM Arnitz, Robin

Discover the art of modern life; learn a new way of thinking and seeing, and create dynamic abstract paintings. Express your inner self through your work with this more personal and expressive mode of painting. This class is designed for all levels of experience. Class process includes discussion of contemporary issues, demonstrations of materials, style, and structure, and the simple concepts behind the actions. In this course you will be painting with acrylics.

Painting: Oil

Enjoy continued exploration of oil paint as a medium, having taken Oil Painting for Beginners, or having some experience working with oils previously. We will explore abstracting from observation, developing a personal narrative, working from memory, as well as some painting in the landscape.

Oil Painting for Beginners04/08/2026 2:00PM Norsworthy, Sarah

In this class students learn the fundamentals of painting with oils, gaining a knowledge of the materials and a range of approaches both historical and contemporary. Through assignments based in observation, students will explore basic concepts of painting such as composing with color, value, gesture, shape, and line, as well as different ways of applying paint to canvas, panel, and paper with brush and palette knife. Students will learn how to create and work from a still-life, self-portrait, as well as from each other.

Abstract Oils with Cold Wax Medium and Mixed Media04/10/2026 10:00AM Gogrof, Andrea

Discover a new creative medium when you combine the classic, rich surfaces of oil painting with the translucent depth and varied textures of cold wax. Exploring these mediums along with acrylic, charcoal, pastels, and ink, including collage, we experiment, discover and learn new ways to give expression to our inner landscape of forms and color.

Painting: Other

Natural Dyes, Making a Sustainable Studio04/09/2026 6:30PM Gottfried, Megan

Students will explore the art and nature of using plant-based materials to create vibrant, eco-friendly dyes. Over consecutive classes, participants will learn the fundamentals of scouring, mordanting, and dyeing various fibers with natural materials like turmeric, avocado pits, and cochineal. The course will include hands-on activities such as immersion dyeing, shibori resist techniques, and eco-printing, with a focus on sustainable practices and the history behind each dye source. By the end of the course, students will have a deeper understanding of natural dyes, how to apply them creatively, and how to integrate sustainable studio practices into their work.

Introduction to Gouache04/11/2026 1:00PM Case, Sam

Gouache is a favorite medium of illustrators and animators, but it's something that many people may not have used before. If you enjoy watercolor or acrylic painting, gouache is the perfect addition to your kit. Join me on to learn a little about the history of this versatile paint and how you can use it and combine it with other paints to make your own gorgeous illustrations and paintings.

Gouache is a favorite medium of illustrators and painters around the world because of its versatility and gorgeous matte finish. Join me as we learn more about this medium, diving into more brushwork and techniques that will help you make your painting sing. Combine the expressive, personal, object-free vision of abstraction with the smaller, intimate beauty of watercolors. The focus of this class is on the elements of design, color and harmony, line and shape while creating an exciting and compelling painting that expresses a personal inner vision. Often alluding to nature or a state of mind, Abstract Watercolors will carry the painter to the beauty of feelings, spirit, and imagination.

Come watercolor Washington's wild mammals! In this beginner to intermediate level class, students will learn techniques to create realistic and accurate watercolor paintings inspired by mammals found throughout our state. You'll build skills for painting fur, texture, and form while learning how to observe and capture animal character. Students will leave with finished watercolor pieces of Washington mammals and the confidence to apply these techniques to other subjects.

Watercolor is one of the most versatile and approachable painting mediums. In this

introductory course we'll be exploring what the medium can do. We'll experiment with watercolors and learn how to blend colors, layer, and play with other materials like sugar and soap to achieve different effects. This class will focus on basic techniques so that you walk away with a solid foundation to take to your next fabulous artwork!

Elevate your watercolor skills and embark on a captivating journey through the world of landscape painting in this intermediate class! Dive into the exploration of texture, colors, and compositional challenges. Through hands-on exercises, you'll practice watercolor techniques, ultimately discovering your personal direction in the realm of watercolor landscapes.

Photography

Working in Color: Intermediate Photography04/11/2026 9:00AM Stahl, Robert

This intermediate digital color class via zoom will explore ways color can work with exposure and composition to produce compelling imagery. We'll examine how different colors interact to create a sense of mood and atmosphere. The selection of color and tone can have a calming effect or generate tension. Primary and secondary colors will be discussed along with warm & cool, monochromatic, and pastel colors. As well, the effects of different kinds of lighting (contrasty & overcast, e.g.) will be seen to influence the perception of color. Tripod is required. The class will have two Sunday morning field trips with the instructor on April 12 & 19 (details given in class). Instructor's work has appeared in National Geographic publications.

Printmaking, Screenprinting & Zines**Screenprinting: Techniques for All Levels**
