Recommended Supplies:

- 3/16" square or round brass or copper rod- 6" minimum
- 20ga or 22ga copper sheet- 3"x3" minimum
- fine silver 3/16" strip (3/16" × 0.010") 30ga dead-soft- 6" minimum
- 22ga sterling silver sheet, 1" × 1" minimum
- sterling silver square wire, 12ga dead soft- 6" minimum
- silver wire solder or sheet solder, 20ga: hard, medium, easy- 6" minimum each
- handy flux
- paintbrush
- Sharpie marker
- Notebook
- Kitchen towel
- 2/0 sawblades, one pack of 12, minimum
